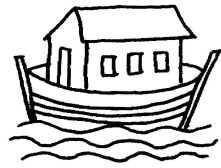


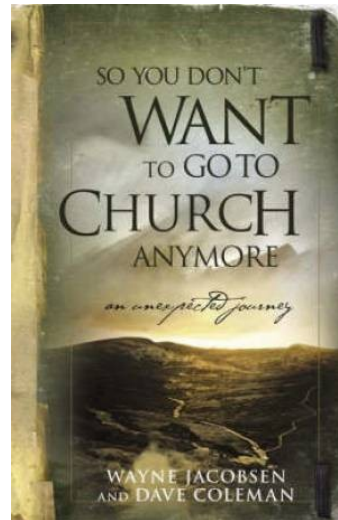
Book Recommendations from

The Ark



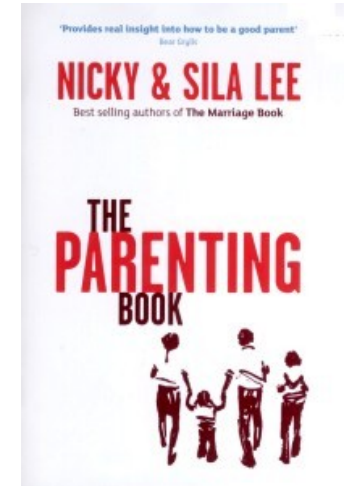
This book left me reeling! The authors create a storyline around the suggestion that the disciple John is still alive and working for Jesus today.

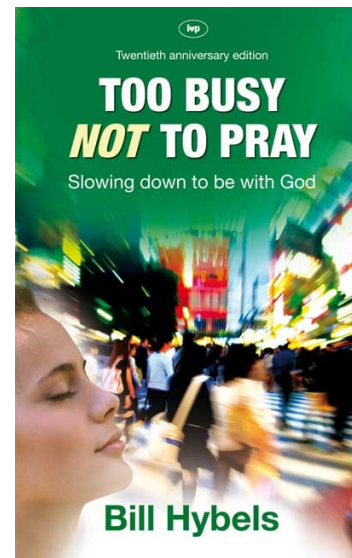
